FIVE O'CLOCK, P. M.

THE house met.

Mr. Harryman delivers a petition from sundry inhabitants of Baltimore county, praying that the owners of lands whereon musters are held may be authorised to erect booths and to sell spirituous liquors; which was read and referred to Mr. Harryman, Mr. Randall and Mr. M. Brown, to consider and report thereon.

Mr. Herbert delivers a petition from Josiah Jones, and others, praying for the sale of the real estate of James Wilson Perry, deceased; which was read and referred to Mr. Herbert, Mr. S. Thomas and Mr. Gaither, to consider and report thereon.

Mr. Wilkinson delivers the following report:

RESOLVED, That Richard Mackall, surviving executor of Benjamin Mackall, of Calvert county, shall be authorised to lay before the auditor his claim as executor aforesaid against the late William and Robert Molleson, and the auditor is hereby authorised and empowered to liquidate and adjust the same, and to ascertain the balance, if any, due thereon to the said Richard Mackall, surviving executor of the said Benjamin Mackall; and the treasurer of the western shore is hereby authorised to pay to the said Richard Mackall, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury, the amount of the balance so to be ascertained by the auditor, provided the sum so to be paid by the treasurer shall not exceed the balance now in the treasury arising from the sale of the property of the said William and Robert Molleson.

Mr. Worthington delivers the following report:

THE committee to whom was referred the memorial of the president and trustees of Charlotte Hall school, beg leave to report, that they have taken the same into consideration, and recommend the following resolution for the adoption of this general assembly.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby authorised and directed to release unto the president and trustees of Charlotte Hall school, all interest due, or that may become due on or before the first day of January, eighteen hundred and eleven, on the loan of the sum of one thousand pounds by this state heretofore made to the said president and trustees, and for the payment of which bond has been given and lodged in the treasury aforesaid.
