The report of the committee on the petitions of old soldiers, was read the second time, and, on motion by Mr. Archer, the following resolution was read:

Whereas the congress of the United States are about taking into consideration the situation of those unfortunate soldiers in the revolutionary war, whose services all are ready and willing to acknowledge, and who have been reduced in their old age to necessitous circumstances: And whereas this house is of opinion, that a compensation to those brave and worthy men who hazarded their lives, and in their early youth destroyed the hopes of an accumulation of fortune in manfully contending for the liberties of their country, should be given by the national legislature, whose constituents have generally been more particularly benefitted than the people of any state composing the federal government; therefore **RESOLVED**, That the consideration of the report of the committee on the petitions of soldiers in the late revolutionary war be referred until the first day of August next. The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follow:
