

That it appears to your committee, by the accounts of said treasurer, he hath paid the sum of £71 2 8, agreeably to the resolutions of November session, 1797, in discharge of the emissions of bills of credit of June, 1780; which emissions your committee have counted and burnt.

It appears to your committee, that in conformity to a resolution of November session, 1806, the treasurer has paid the sum of £40 12 7 in discharge of bills of exchange, drawn according to an act of assembly passed at November session, 1779, entitled, An act for calling out of circulation certain bills of credit emitted by an act of assembly; which bills of exchange your committee have examined and cancelled. It also appears to your committee, that pursuant to a resolution of November session, 1809, the said treasurer hath paid the sum of £125 18 9 in discharge of bills of exchange, drawn according to the above recited act of assembly.

That it appears to your committee, the said treasurer hath paid away, from the first of November, 1809, to the first of November, 1810, the sum of 31 dollars 34 cents funded six per cent. stock, 15 dollars 66 cents deferred six per cent. stock, 23 dollars 50 cents funded three per cent. stock, £37 3 11 of the emissions of bills of credit, made by an act of congress of the 18th March, 1780, and the sum of £44,746 18 10½ specie, for all which payments have been produced to your committee the necessary vouchers and receipts, and that there remains in the treasury the sum of 126,570 dollars 99 cents funded six per cent. stock, 474,277 dollars 62 cents deferred six per cent. stock, 263,448 dollars 76 cents funded three per cent. stock, £2062 3 11½ of the emissions of bills of credit, made by an act of congress of the 18th March, 1780, and the sum of £43718 9 3½ specie; which sum of specie is appropriated in the manner following, viz.
