On motion by Mr. Marriott, the question was put, That the following be inserted in the third clause after the word "line?" "And if the general assembly, at their next session, shall approve of the proceedings of the said commissioners, and ratify and confirm the line which shall be ascertained by them, the line so ascertained and confirmed, shall then and for ever afterwards be considered the divisional line between the said two counties."
