Which was read.

The bill to authorise the levy court of Saint-Mary's county to assess and levy a sum of money for the benefit of John Trueman Graves, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill for the relief of Jacob Kiler, the bill to lay out a certain road in Harford county, the bill to pay the civil list and other expenses of civil government, the bill to provide for the building a bridge over Big Pipe Creek, in Frederick county, the bill to authorise a lottery or lotteries in the city of Baltimore for the purpose therein mentioned, the bill for the relief of William Caton, the supplement to an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from near Ellicott's lower mills towards Georgetown, in the district of Columbia, the supplement to the act, entitled, An act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money to purchase a fire-engine, and erect pumps, in the town of Easton, in Talbot county, the bill to authorise and empower the levy court of Montgomery county to assess and levy a sum of money on the assessable property thereof for the purpose of building a clerk's office in said county, the bill relating to criminals in Baltimore county, the bill for the relief of Isaac Hazlehurst and Andrew Hazlehurst, of the city of Baltimore, the supplement to an act, entitled, An act to confirm a road in Harford and Baltimore counties, and the bill for the relief of William Maxwell, of the city of Baltimore, severally endorsed, "will pass." Ordered, to be engrossed. The bill for the relief of Michael Walton, of the city of Baltimore, the bill to prevent nuisance in the neighbourhood of fisheries on the river Susquehanna and at the head of the Chesapeake bay, and the bill to authorise the filling up and extending of certain lots on the south side of the basin in the city of Baltimore, severally endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were read, agreed to, and the bills ordered to be engrossed. The bill for the relief of Abraham Fuller, of the city of Baltimore, endorsed, "will not pass." The resolution relative to the exchange of laws with Virginia, endorsed, "assented to." And the resolution in favor of George W. Bradford, endorsed, "dissented from."

Mr. Dennis delivers a bill, entitled, An act to appoint by the people judges of elections in the several counties of this state; which was read.

The speaker laid before the house, an account from the register in chancery, of seals and taxes; which was read.
