The bill to continue in force the acts of assembly which expire with the present session, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

The bill to alter and change the public road leading from or near Mile's river ferry to the Methodist meeting-house, in Talbot county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

"not be necessary for that building, or its different appertenances, to be holden by the mayor and city council aforesaid, for the purpose of erecting thereon a city hall and watch-house, with other improvements, for their use and accommodation," for the purpose of inserting the following: "be necessary for building thereon a watch-house." Resolved in the affirmative.

The question was then put, Shall the said bill pass? Resolved in the affirmative, and the bill sent to the senate.

The bill for the relief of the heirs of Zephaniah Benston, was referred to the next general assembly.

Mr. A. Browne delivers a bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the town of Cumberland, in Allegany county; which was read.

On the second reading of the resolutions relative to district schools, on motion by Mr. Boyle, the question was put, That the following be added to the question propounded in the first resolution, to wit: "and shall suggest the plan which in his opinion is the most practicable." Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Archer, the said resolutions were referred to the next general assembly.

The report in favour of Cornelius Mills, was read, assented to, and sent to the senate.

The bill for the benefit of Luther Martin, of the city of Baltimore, was read the second time, and, on motion by Mr. Willis, the question was put, That the same be referred to the next general assembly? The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follow:
