To Mr. Martin, An act to repeal the act authorising the appointment of state's agents. Messrs. Martin, Banning, Millis, Turner and Price, were appointed a committee to prepare and

report the bill.

To Mr. Blakistone, An act to prevent persons, nonresidents of St. Mary's county, from hauling any seine or net, or catching oysters, in the waters of the Potomac river, immediately bordering upon the lands of said county, or in any of its tributaries, connected with, or adjoining said county, and for other pur-Messrs. Blakistone, Gough and Bourne, were appointed a committee to prepare and report the same.

To Mr. Hitch, An act to alter and change the constitution and form of government of this state, so far as relates to the division of Worcester county into election districts. Messrs. Hitch, Hooper, and Williams of Worcester, were appointed a commit-

tee to prepare and report the bill.

To Mr. Thomas of Cecil, An act to change the name of a certain point on the Susquenanna river in Cecil county. Messrs. Thomas of Cecil, Harlan and Mackey, were appointed a committee to prepare and report the bill. Mr. Thomas of Cecil, accordingly reported said bill; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

To Mr. Shriver, An act to incorporate the trustees of the Westminster general meeting house, in Frederick county. Messrs. Shriver, Thomas of Frederick, and Holtz, were ap-

pointed a committee to prepare and report the bill.

To Mr. Potter, An act supplementary to the act for building a bridge over the north west branch of the Nanticoke river, in Caroline county, at or near a place called the Old Bloomary, and for other purposes therein mentioned. Messrs. Potter, Orrell and Jones, were appointed a committee to prepare and report the bill.

To Mr. Wells, A further supplement to the act for the recovery of small debts out of court, and to repeal the acts af assembly therein mentioned. Messrs. Wells, Watkins, Steuart of Baltimore, Goldsborough, Thomas of St. Mary's, and Linthioum, were appointed a committee to prepare and report the bill.

Mr. Teackle obtained leave to withdraw the petition of William Robertson, of Somerset county, and Esther his wife, presented on the 4th instant, and the bill reported by the committee to whom the same was referred, which was rejected by the

house on the 8th instant.

On motion by Mr. Donoho, the bill reported by him, entitled, An act to alter and amend so much of the constitution and form of government as relates to the appointment of registers of wills in each of the counties in this state, was made the order of the day for Monday the 21st instant.
