On motion by Mr. Ely, the house agreed to reconsider the eighteenth section of the bill;

When he moved to amend the same, by striking out these words, "together with one of the books of the polls from each election district," in the fifth and sixth lines of that section, in the printed bill.

And the question thereon being taken, it was decided in the negative.

Mr. Buskirk offered the following amendment, as an additional section, to be inserted at the end of the bill, viz.

"That nothing in this act contained shall operate to stop, or in anywise interfere with, any suit which may have been instituted, at the instance of the state, against any person under the laws repealed by this act, but the same shall be prosecuted to a final determination, and all other proceedings shall be had thereon, as if this act had not passed."

And the question thereon, being taken, was resolved in the affirmative.

The question was then propounded, Shall the said bill pass as amended? And it was resolved in the affirmative.

The clerk of the senate returned the bill, entitled, An act to regulate the meeting of the orphans court of Anne-Arundel county, endorsed, 'will pass.' And also the resolution in favour of the late state's agent for the western shore, endorsed 'assented to.'

Ordered, That the said bill and resolution be engrossed.
