

Ordered, That the said bills respectively be engrossed.

Also an act for the relief of Elijah Norris, of Harford county.

An act to repeal all such parts of the constitution and form of government as relate to the division of Frederick county into eleven election districts, and for other purposes.

A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to empower the levy court of Kent county to grant relief to indigent persons, in said county, passed at December session 1827, chapter 59.

And a supplement to the act, entitled, An act to incorporate the Baltimore and Washington Rail Road Company, passed at the present session of the general assembly of Maryland, severally endorsed 'will not pass.'

And delivered bills, originated in and passed by the senate, of the following titles, viz.

1. An act to regulate the issuing of writs of certiorari to justices of the peace, and the proceedings thereon.

2. An act to provide for the distribution of that part of the school fund which is appropriated to Baltimore county.

3. And, an act to prevent the destruction of oysters within the waters of this state.

Which said bills were read by their respective titles, and severally referred, as follows, viz:

The first to the committee on grievances and courts of justice.

The second to a select committee, consisting of Messrs. Ely, Turner of Baltimore county, and Shower.

And whereupon, Mr. Ely, from that committee, reported said bill without amendment; which was then read the first, and by a special order, the second time, passed and returned to the senate.

And the third of said bills was referred to a select committee, consisting of Messrs. Kent, Turner, of Calvert, and Hawkins.

Mr. M. Mahon of Baltimore city, chairman of the committee on grievances and courts of justice, to which had been severally referred the bills from the senate, entitled, An additional supplement to the act entitled, An act relating to sheriffs, and for other purposes.

An act relating to pleas of Misnomer.

And, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act to provide a summary mode of recovering possession of lands and tenements holden by tenants for years, or at will, after the expiration of their terms; reported verbally, that the said committee had considered said bills, respectively, and were of the opinion, that each of them ought to pass, without amendment.

The said bills were then severally read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.
