

Mr. Shriver presented the petition of sundry citizens of Frederick county, praying for the passage of a supplement to the act passed at December Session, 1828, chapter 89, authorising commissioners, therein named, to survey, locate and open a road through Montgomery, Anne-Arundel, and part of Frederick counties, to Union-Town; whereby provision may be made for the extension of said road to Union Mills, and thence to the Pennsylvania line, in the direction of Hanover, in said State; which petition was referred to a select committee, consisting of Messrs. Shriver, Dorsey and Kinzer.

Mr. Kinzer presented the petition of a number of the members of the German Baptists', or Tunkers' Society, of Frederick county, praying for the passage of an act confirming that part of the last will and testament of Rudolph Switzer, late of Frederick county, deceased, as relates to a legacy bequeathed by him, in trust, for the support of the poor of said society; which petition was referred to a select committee, consisting of Messrs. Kinzer, Shriver and Irving.

Mr. Wells presented the petition of Rebecca Key, Frances Campbell, and Frances Fowler, of the City of Annapolis, praying that a sum of money may be levied on Anne-Arundel county; annually, for each of them, in consideration of their inability to support themselves; which was referred to the committee on county pensions to indigent persons.

Mr. Claude presented the petition of Henry W. Fitzhugh, an officer of the United States Army, recently removed to this State by the orders of the General Government, praying for permission to bring into the State, certain negro slaves, the servants and personal property of the petitioner; which petition was referred to a select committee, consisting of Messrs. Claude, Wells and Hungerford.

Mr. Teackle presented the petition of sundry citizens of Somerset county, praying that the justices of the levy court may be elected by the people; which was referred to a select committee, consisting of Messrs. Teackle, Yoc, Hughlett, Dorsey, Burchenal, Sudler and Swan.

Mr. Harding presented the petition of sundry citizens of Montgomery county, praying that the levy court of said county may be authorised to levy a sum of money for the purchase of certain valuable papers relating to lands in said county, which belong to the estate of Lloyd Adamson, deceased, the late surveyor of said county, to be preserved as public records, for the use of the said county; which petition was referred to a select committee, consisting of Messrs. Harding, Gittings and Willson.
