4. For the Broadsides, at seven dollars and twenty-fivecents per sheet, 106 copies.

5. For the Laws, at two dollars and fifty cents per page,

1,600 copies.

The Journals to be finished for the use of the Executive and Legislature, within twelve hours from the delivery of the MSS. The other works to be executed without delay, with the power reserved of annulling the contract in case of failure. The laws to be passed, and with the journal, to be completed, and deposited in the Council Chamber in thirty days from the delivery of the copy—the same number of copies to be bound in leather;—to have as much matter on each page, and the execution in all respects to be as complete, in as good stile, and the paper to be as good as of the last Session.

The Rule and Figure work to be in Octavo form, if required, and to be paid for at the same rate per page as re-

ports and documents.

The committee further report, that the prices of the last session were as follows, to wit:

For the Journals, three dollars and twenty-five cents per page.

For the Bills, one dollar and fifty cents per page.

For the Reports and Documents, one dollar and seventyfive cents per page.

For the Broadsides, fifteen dollars per sheet.

For the Laws, four dollars per page.

From which it appears, that by the terms contracted for by your committee, a considerable saving has accrued to the State in this branch of the public expenditures.

The Committee also recommends the adopting of the

following resolution.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That on the delivery of the Laws and Journal in the Council Chamber, the Governor and Council are hereby authorised and empowered to settle the account of Jeremiah Hughes, acording to the terms of the contract entered into with him for the printing of the present Session.
