Ordered, That a select committee of three members be appointed by the Speaker, to prepare and report said bill.

Messrs. Goldsborough, Steele, and Hicks, were appointed the said committee, pursuant to the order.

Mr. Buchanan asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled An act, supplementary to An act passed in December session, 1819, chapter 84, relating to insolvent debtors in the city and county of Baltimore.

And on his motion, it was

Ordered, That a select committee of three members be appointed by the Speaker, to prepare and report said bill.

Messrs. Buchanan, Turner of Baltimore county, and Ely, were appointed the said committee, pursuant to the order.

Mr. Johnson asked and obtained leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled A supplement to the act, entitled An act to incorporate the Trustees of the Poor of Baltimore city and county, passed at December session, 1822.
