

Mr. Buchanan, Chairman of the Committee on Divorces, to which the subject had been referred, reported a bill, entitled, an act to divorce John Russell and Eleanor, his wife, of Charles County,—which bill was read the first, and, on motion of Mr. Buchanan, the second time, by a special order, passed, and sent to the Senate for concurrence.

The Clerk of the Senate returned the bills of this House, of the following titles:

An act for the benefit of Henry W. Fitzhugh, now of the city of Annapolis.

An act for the relief of George Shover, late of Loudon County, Virginia, and now confined, for debt, in the jail of Allegany County; and,

An act to change the time of holding the November term of Somerset County Court,—severally endorsed 'will pass.'

Ordered, That the said bills be severally engrossed.

And delivered the following message, which was read, viz:

On motion of Mr. Burchenal, the amendments proposed by the Senate to the bill of this House, entitled, an act supplemental to an act, entitled, an act for the regulation and improvement of the village of Denton, in Caroline County, and for other purposes, were taken up for consideration, read the second time, severally assented to, and the said bill was thereupon ordered to be engrossed.

Mr. Goldsborough, from the select committee appointed for the purpose, reported a bill, entitled; an act to alter and repeal the act, entitled, an act to alter the present mode of appointing the Justices of the Levy Court of Dorchester County, so that each election district may have one member, passed at December session, eighteen hundred and twenty-three, chapter thirty-six—which said bill was read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.
