And delivered a communication from the Executive Department, (received and referred by the Senate to the consideration of this house,) which was read, and is as follows:

On motion by Mr. Thomas, of Saint Mary's, the committee on internal improvement, to which was yesterday referred the memorial and petition presented by Mr. Dorsey, of the stockholders in the Westminister, Taneytown, and Emmittsburgh Turnpike Road, and others, citizens of Frederick county, praying that a law may pass to authorize the loan of a certain sum of money, on the credit of the State, for the completion of the turnpike road from Westminster to Emmittsburg, in said county; was discharged from the further consideration thereof, and the same was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means

On motion by Mr. Done,

The House then adjourned until to-morrow morning, ten o'clock.
