

Mr. Shriver presented a petition from captain John Trucks, of Frederick county, praying that the state would remunerate him for certain services rendered the public; which was referred to the Committee on Claims.

Mr. Shriver also presented a memorial of sundry citizens of Westminster, and its vicinity, in Frederick county, praying the passage of an act to incorporate the Westminster Academy; which memorial was referred to a select committee consisting of Messrs. Shriver, Dorsey, and Kinzer.

Mr. Johns presented a petition of the commissioners of Harford county, Preston McComas, and Hannah, his wife, and sundry other citizens of said county, praying the passage of a law for the purpose of confirming certain proceedings of said commissioners therein mentioned, in relation to the building of a bridge; which petition was referred to a select committee, consisting of Messrs. Johns, Hope and Moores.

Mr. Hope had leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled an act for the re-assessment and re-valuation of the real and personal property in Harford county; and Messrs. Hope, Johns, and Sutton, were appointed a select committee to prepare and report said bill.

Whereupon, Mr. Hope, from that committee, accordingly reported said bill; which was read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Nicholas had leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled a supplement to the act, entitled an act relating to actions of replevin, passed December session 1825, chap. 65.

And thereupon Messrs. Nicholas, Hunt and Brawner, were appointed a select committee, to prepare and report said bill.

Mr. Creswell had leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled an act to establish and confirm certain acts done by a justice of the peace in Cecil county.

And thereupon, Messrs. Creswell, Gale and Comegys, were appointed a select committee to prepare and report said bill.

Mr. Johns had leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled an additional supplement to the act, entitled an act for the better regulation of the forty and forty-second regiments and extra battalion of militia in Harford county.

And thereupon, Messrs. Johns, Sutton and Ely, were appointed a select committee to prepare and report said bill.
