

A supplement to the act, entitled an act to regulate the fees of certain officers, severally endorsed "will not pass."

A resolution authorising an appropriation for furniture and repairs of the government house, endorsed "assented to."

Ordered, That the said resolution be engrossed.

And delivered two several bills originated in, and passed by the Senate, entitled

An act to continue the act passed at December session 1813, entitled an act to incorporate the Patapsco Insurance Company; and

An act to authorise the leasing of certain property in Baltimore county; which were read by their respective titles, and severally referred to select committees, viz. the former to a select committee consisting of Messrs. Nicholas, Hunt and Johnson; and the latter to a select committee consisting of Messrs. Nicholas, Hunt and Ely.

Mr. Teackle moved that the house do now adjourn until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.

And the question thereon was taken, and resolved in the affirmative.

The house accordingly adjourned until to morrow morning 10 o'clock.

### WEDNESDAY, February 10th, 1830.

The House met at ten o'clock, pursuant to adjournment; and the roll being called over; the same members were present as on yesterday.

On motion by Mr. Hicks the rule of the House requiring the journal of proceedings of the preceding day to be read; was suspended; and the reading of said journal was dispensed with.

Mr. Stewart presented a petition of Julian Gambrill, of Anne-Arundel county, praying that a law may pass authorizing the commissioners of said county to allow her some pecuniary aid for the support of herself and childred; which was referred to the committee on county pensions.

Mr. Hunt presented a petition of Thomas L. Usher, an imprisoned debtor in Baltimore county jail, praying for a special act of insolvency, providing for his release; which was referred to the committee on insolvency.

Mr. Ely presented a petition of Henry Davis, of the city of Baltimore, praying for the passage of an act, to release him from the bond of matrimony, with his wife Caroline
