the bill is of the greatest importance to the petitioner, which will appear manifest to your honorable body, by the additional testimony herewith presented. We therefore hope you will re-consider your vote of rejection, and pass the bill.

On motion by Mr. Blakistone, the following resolution was read the first, and by a special order, the second time, assented to, and sent to the Senate for concurrence, viz:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay unto Sarah Magee, of Saint Mary's county, or her order, the amount of money due to William Magee, her deceased husband, a pensioner of this State.

Mr. Sutton submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Governor and Council be, and they are hereby, authorised to enquire into, and ascertain whether, the claim due from the estate of Thomas Hall, deceased, can be collected, and to ascertain whether it would be expedient to institute suit for the recovery of the lands now held by the heirs of William Osborn, and to release the claim of the State to said land and said bond, if the Executive shall deem it expedient to do so.

Which was read the first time; and, on motion of Mr. Moores, referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Mr. Buskirk moved the following resolutions:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby, authorised to subscribe in the name of the State, for eighty seven copies of a new edition of Harris's Entries, about to be published in the city of Baltimore, by Lucas & Deaver, with directions that the said number of copies shall be delivered to the Governor and Council.

Resolved, That the Governor upon the receipt of the said eighty-seven copies, be and he is hereby authorized to draw upon the Treasury for a sum of money, not exceeding the sum of eight hundred and seventy dollars, to be appropriated to pay for the said copies.

Resolved, That the Governor and Council, cause the said copies when received, to be distributed and forwarded as

follows:

To the Courts of Appeals for the Eastern and Western Shores, five copies each.

To the Court of Chancery, two copies.
To the County Courts, two copies each.

To the City Court of Baltimore, two copies.
