

A resolution respecting certain printed copies of the Journals of Proceedings and Laws of the General Assembly, remaining in the clerks office of Harford county court; severally endorsed 'assented to.'

Ordered, That the bills, with their respective amendments, and the resolutions above mentioned, be severally engrossed; Also,

An act to Incorporate the Canton Furnace Company;

An act to lay out a road in Allegany county; And,

An act to repeal and alter all such parts of the Constitution and form of Government, as relate to the division of Baltimore county into election districts; severally endorsed, 'will not pass.'

And conveying a bill, originated in, and passed by the Senate, entitled,

An act to authorise Charles Howard, of the city of Baltimore, guardian of James McHenry, to lease certain portions of the estate of said ward; which said bill was read by its title, and referred to a select committee, consisting of Messrs. Hunt, Ely and Johnson.

The several bills and the resolutions of this house, passed yesterday, were sent to the Senate for concurrence; the titles whereof are as follows:

An act for the relief of sundry poor persons in the several counties therein mentioned.

An act concerning the Washington and Baltimore Turnpike Road Company.

An act to extend real estate.

An act to authorise the persons therein named to bring into this state certain slaves.

An act to authcrise and empower the Trustees of the Poor and Commissioners for Harford county, to purchase Woodland, and for other purposes And,

An act to authorise the Justices of the Orphan's and Levy courts of Dorchester county, to appoint their respective Criers.

Resolutions in relation to the term of service and mode of electing the President and Vice-President of the United States; the Colonization Society, and the present Tariff of Duties on Imports.
