On motion by Mr. Teackle, leave given to bring in a bill, ontitled, An act to amend the act of December session 1829, chapter 87 Ordered, That Messrs. Teackle, Jeniser, Hicks, Gough and Spence, report the same.

On motion by Mr. Ely, leave given to bring in a bill, to be entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act relating to insolvent debtors in the city and county of Baltimore, passed at December session 1816, chapter 221. Ordered, That Messrs. Ely, Holmes and Worthington, prepare and bring in the same.

On motion by Mr. Ballard, leave given to bring in a bill to authorise Thomas L. Waters of Somerset county, to bring certain negroes from the state of Virginia into this state. Ordered, That Messrs. Ballard, Chapman and Tilghman, report the same.

On motion by Mr. Moores, leave given to bring in a bill, to be entitled, An additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act to regulate the issuing of licenses to traders, keepers of ordinaries and others. Ordered, That Messrs. Moores, McMahon and Teackle, prepare and bring in the same.

On motion by Mr. Hawkins, Ordered, That the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims inquire into the expediency of placing Robert McClellanee, of St. Mary's county, on the pension list.

On motion by Mr. M'Elfresh, the following resolution was read:

Resolved, That the governor and council be and they are hereby directed, to cause to be furnished to the mayor, aldermen, and the boards of aldermen and common council of the city of Frederick; also to the mayor, recorder and aldermen of the city of Annapolis, each one copy of the laws of the present session, and of each succeeding session, in the same manner as justices of the peace now are, and that an additional number be printed for that purpose.
