John N. Steele, Esquire, a delegate returned for Dorchester county, appeared, qualified, and took his seat.

Mr. Yoe submitted the following order:

Ordered, That the petitions of sundry citizens of Allegany, Washington and Frederick counties, praying for the removal of the court of appeals from the city of Annapolis, to the city of Baltimore, which were before the legislature of this state in eighteen hundred and twenty nine, be referred to the committee of grievances and courts of justice, with instructions to inquire into the expediency of reporting thereon by bill or otherwise.

Which was read.

When, on motion by Mr. Nicholas, the following was offered by him as a substitute.

Ordered, That the committee on grievances and courts of justice be instructed to inquire into the expediency of removing the sittings of the court of appeals from the city of Annapolis to the city of Baltimore; and to report thereon by bill or otherwise.

The question was first taken on the adoption of the substitute. Determined in the negative.

Mr. Brawner offered as an amendment to said order, the words "withdrawn from the files of this house and" to be inserted after the word "be;" which amendment was accepted by Mr. Yoe.

Mr. Jenifer then moved that said order be laid on the table. Determined in the negative.

The question was then put, That the house assent to the order as amended? Resolved in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Gantt, Ordered, That the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims inquire into the propriety of placing Benjamin Howard, late a private in the army of the revolution, on the pension list.

Mr. Edelen reported a bill, entitled, An act to restrain attorneys and solicitors in chancery, from entering their appearance to any suit, bill or action at law or in equity, in the courts of this state without special authority.

Mr. Ridgely reported a bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of William Workman, of Allegany county.

And Mr. Smith reported a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of William Clare, late collector of the tax for Calvert county; which were read.
