The bill, entitled, An act authorising the clerk of Frederick county to record a deed executed by Peter Frick, of the city and county of Baltimore, conveying certain lands therein mentioned, to Peter H. Brown, of Frederick county, was read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

On motion by Mr. Gittings, leave was given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act for the revaluation of the real and personal property in Montgomery county, and for other purposes. Ordered, That Messrs. Gittings, Harding and Willson, report the same.

Mr. Hunt delivered the following report and resolution; which was twice read, passed, and sent to the senate.

The committee appointed to examine the condition of the furniture in the government house, respectfully report:

That they have inspected the furniture, as well as the state of the buildings, and have returned herewith an inventory of the articles found therein.

It will be seen that there is a great deficiency of articles that are essential to the comfort of the governor of the state. The table-linen, hardware, china, kitchen utensils, and a great many other necessary articles of furniture, require replacing, or adding to. The offices, out-buildings and enclosures, are in a dilapidated condition, and the roof of the house seems to be unsafe.

The committee take pleasure in giving their full approbation to the neat order in which they found every thing kept by the steward, Mr. Nicholls.

The committee recommend an appropriation of five hundred dollars, in addition to the balance remaining unexpended by his excellency the late governor, for the purpose of purchasing such articles of furniture and making such repairs, as his excellency, the present governor, may deem necessary for the government house.
