Mr. Nicholas presented a memorial from Abraham Jarret, of the city of Baltimore, praying an alteration in the laws providing for the inspection of salted fish; which was read and referred to the standing committee on inspections.

To the Hon'ble
The President of the Senate,
Sir,

In arranging the papers of the office since the adjournment of the executive, I have found a communication from the acting governor of the state of Louisiana, of the 20th April last, enclosing resolutions of that state, adopted at their last session, upon the subject of the tariff of 1828.

As I understand that an order has passed the house of delegates directing the documents accompanying the governor's communication of the 29th December to be printed, I deem it proper, thus informally, to place these resolutions in possession of the legislature, under the impression that they would prefer having them printed at the same time with similar communications.
