On motion by Mr. Ely, leave was given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to suspend the statute of limitations in certain cases therein mentioned. Ordered, That Messrs. Ely, Nicholas and Steele, report the same.

Mr. Gale reported a bill, entitled, An additional supplement to an act. entitled, A supplement to an act to incorporate the Port Deposit and Chesapeake turnpike road company, passed at December session 1827, chapter 200; which was read.

And Mr. Moores reported a bill, entitled, An act authorising Doctor William J. M'Elhiney, of Harford county, to remove certain negroes from the state of Virginia into this state; which was read the first and second time by special order, and passed.

The bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of William Workman, of Allegany county, was read the second time and passed.

The house proceeded to consider the amendments proposed by the senate, to the bill, entitled, An act to preserve the side-walks in the village of Union Town, in Frederick county; which amendments were severally read the second time, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

On motion by Mr. M'Elfresh, seconded by Messrs. M'Kinstrey and Richardson, who voted in the majority, to reconsider the decision of the house on the bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to promote the preservation, improvement, and increase of shell fish in this state; it was resolved in the affirmative.
