

On motion by *Mr. Ely*, leave was given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to suspend the statute of limitations in certain cases therein mentioned. Ordered, That *Messrs. Ely, Nicholas and Steele*, report the same.

*Mr. Gale* reported a bill, entitled, An additional supplement to an act. entitled, A supplement to an act to incorporate the Port Deposit and Chesapeake turnpike road company, passed at December session 1827, chapter 200; which was read.

And *Mr. Moores* reported a bill, entitled, An act authorising *Doctor William J. M'Elhiney*, of Harford county, to remove certain negroes from the state of Virginia into this state; which was read the first and second time by special order, and passed.

The bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of *William Workman*, of Allegany county, was read the second time and passed.

The house proceeded to consider the amendments proposed by the senate, to the bill, entitled, An act to preserve the side-walks in the village of Union Town, in Frederick county; which amendments were severally read the second time, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

On motion by *Mr. M'Elfresh*, seconded by *Messrs. M'Kinstrey and Richardson*, who voted in the majority, to reconsider the decision of the house on the bill, entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to promote the preservation, improvement, and increase of shell fish in this state; it was resolved in the affirmative.
