The bill, entitled, An act relative to a part of the Westminster and Hagerstown turnpike road, was read the second time, and passed.

Mr. Lee submitted the following resolution; which was read the first and second time, by special order, and assented to.

Resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore be, and he is hereby authorised and directed, to invest the sum of money due to Montgomery county, on account of the free schools fund, in the reserved shares of stock, in the Commercial and Farmers Bank of Baltimore.
