to alter the name of Caleb Smith, of Dorchester county, were severally read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

On motion by Mr. Rogerson, leave was given to bring in a bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the distribution of a certain fund for the purpose of establishing free schools in the several counties therein mentioned. Ordered, That Messrs. Rogerson, Chapman and Ballard, report the same.

Mr. Biles submitted the following order:

Ordered, That the committee on education be instructed to inquire into the propriety and expediency of withdrawing the donations from the several colleges and academies of this state, for the purpose of appropriating the same to the support of primary or county schools, and that they report by bill or otherwise.

On the question being put on the adoption of said order,

it was determined in the negative.
