On motion by Mr. Teackle, the bill reported by him, entitled, An act to establish the bank of the state of Maryland, was made the order of the day for Wednesday the 26th instant.

A deputation from the senate being announced, Messrs. Forrest and Rees, members of that body, appeared within the bar, and acquainted the speaker and the house of delegates, that, in accordance with the joint invitations of both houses, which had been personally communicated to him, the governor elect was then attending in the senate chamber, where the senate requested the attendance of the speaker, with that of the other members of this house, to witness the qualification of the governor elect.

The speaker thereupon left the chair, and attended by the members of this house, went to the senate chamber, where the honorable Daniel Martin was duly qualified as governor of the state of Maryland, in the presence of both houses, in the manner and form prescribed by the constitution and laws thereof. The speaker, attended by the members of the house, returned and resumed the chair.

The house then adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.

William Hughlett, Esq. a delegate returned for Talbot county, appeared, qualified, and took his seat.

The bill, entitled, An act to authorise and empower John W. Richardson, to import and bring into this state, certain negroes therein mentioned; and the bill, entitled, An act to restrain attorneys and solicitors in chancery, from entering their appearance to any suit, bill or action, at law or in equity, in the courts of this state, without special authority; were sent to the senate.

Mr. Wright, presented the petition of Harriet Clarke, of Dorchester county, praying that her name may be changed to that of Harriet Eccleston; which was read and referred to Messrs. Wright, Keene and Hicks.

Mr. Willson, presented the petition of Robert Soaper, of Montgomery county, praying to be placed on the pension list.
