

Mr. Hunt reported a bill, entitled, A further and an additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act concerning crimes and punishments.

Mr. McMahon reported a bill, entitled, An act for the better collection of the county charges in Allegany county.

And Mr. Tilghman reported a bill, entitled, An act to provide for the consolidation and distribution of the several school funds; which were severally read.

The resolution in favour of Benjamin Smith, of the state of Kentucky, and the resolution in favour of Thomas Jenkins of the District of Columbia, and the resolution authorising and directing the governor to procure and present to captain George W. Rogers a sword, as further evidence of the high sense the legislature entertain for the services he has rendered his country; were severally read the second time; assented to, and sent to the senate.

The house proceeded to consider the bill reported by Mr. Blakistone, entitled, An act relating to the summoning of jurors in Baltimore city; when on motion by Mr. Hunt said bill was ordered to lie on the table.

The house proceeded to consider the bill reported by Mr. Turner entitled, An additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act authorising the appointing inspectors and corders of fire wood brought by water to the city of Baltimore for sale: when on motion by Mr. Ely, said bill was ordered to lie on the table.

The house proceeded to consider the bill reported by Mr. Brown, of Kent, entitled, An act to encourage the destruction of crows in the several counties therein mentioned; when on motion by Mr. Brown of Q. Anne's, Queen Anne's county was stricken out of said bill.

On motion by Mr. Biles, Cecil county was also stricken out.

Mr. Brown, of Kent, then, moved as a substitute therefor, a bill, entitled, An act to encourage the destruction of crows in Kent county; which was twice read, adopted and sent to the senate.

Mr. Melfresh reported a bill, entitled, An act to provide for the prompt payment of witnesses in criminal cases.

And Mr. Wright reported a bill, entitled, An act to alter the name of Harriet Clark of Dorchester county; which were severally read.

Mr. Brookhart reported a bill, entitled, An act to authorise the recording of the will of Christian Wyandt, late of
