

commend, that a message be sent to the senate, proposing to your honourable body the appointment of a committee, to join a committee of five members to be appointed by this house; and that such joint committee be instructed to repair to Baltimore, that they may there be more fully enabled to inquire into and ascertain, the views of the trustees of said institutions, by personal intercourse with them, and more fully judge of the condition and prospects of those institutions, and of the propriety of granting the objects of said memorial.

The house proceeded to consider the resolution for compensation to the attorney general for services performed by him, in pursuance of the resolution of the general assembly of December session 1828, No. 26.

When on motion by Mr. Nicholas, the blank therein was filled up with two hundred and fifty dollars.

The resolution was then read the second time, assented to, and sent to the senate.

The door-keeper having returned, reported, that he had notified the absent members to attend in the house.

The house then resumed the consideration of the order of the day; when Mr. Jenifer moved that said bill be rejected? Resolved in the affirmative.
