The bill, entitled, An act to abolish all and every such parts of the constitution and form of government in this state, as relate to the appointment of the offices of register of wills and clerks of the county courts of this state; and the bill, entitled, An act to abolish all such parts of the constitution and form of government as relates to the time and manner of electing the senate, and the mode of filling up vacancies in that body, so that each county and the city of Baltimore may have a senator, to be elected immediately by the people, were sent to the senate.

The speaker laid before the house a report from the treasurer of the western shore, in obedience to an order of this house, adopted on the 18th inst. relative to the number of shares for which the state has a right to subscribe in the several banks of this state, and which are yet unsubscribed for; which was read.

Also a communication from the honourable Samuel Smith, transmitting two copies of the annual report of the secretary of the treasury on the finances of the United States
