And Mr. Teackle presented the memorial and petition of John Cullen, and others, of Somerset county, praying for the establishment of a State Bank; which was read and referred to the committee already appointed on that subject.

On motion by Mr. Merrick, the following message was read, assented to, and sent to the senate:

By the House of Delegates,

Jan. 24th, 1831.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

As the session of the legislature will probably close at no distant day, we feel it incumbent upon us again most respectfully to invite your attention to the necessity of taking care that the state of Maryland shall not be left without a full representation in the senate of the United States.

The term of service of the honourable Ezekiel F. Chambers will expire on the 3d day of March next, and as Congress will be regularly convened before the meeting of the Legislature, not to mentionthat in a time when such wonderful convulsions and changes are occurring among the kingdoms of the earth, it is not impossible but an extraordinary call of Congress may become necessary; we propose with the concurrence of your honourable body, to go on Friday the 28th inst. at 12 o'clock. into the election of a senator to supply the vacancy, agreeably to the constitution and to the act of assembly.
