

The message adopted by this house on yesterday, proposing an early adjournment of the legislature; and the bill, entitled, An act authorising and empowering the commissioners of Harford county to build a bridge over Deer creek at or near Death's Ford, were sent to the senate.

Mr. Merrick presented the petition of sundry citizens of Clear Spring, Washington county, praying that a bank may be established in Williamsport; which was read and referred to Messrs. Merrick, Yoe and Kershner.

Mr. Comegys presented the petition of sundry citizens of Cecil and Kent counties, praying the passage of an act incorporating a company to build a bridge over the Sassafras river, from Frederick town, in Cecil county, to Georgetown, in Kent county; which was read and referred to Messrs. Comegys, Evans, Biles, Brown of Kent, and Moffett.

Mr. Hood presented the petition of sundry inhabitants of Baltimore and Anne-Arundel counties, praying for the passage of an act authorising the building of a bridge across the Patapsco river near the Thistle factory; which was read and referred to Messrs. Hood, Stewart, Turner, Worthington and M'Elfresh.

Mr. Stewart presented the petition of sundry inhabitants of primary school district No. 22, in Anne-Arundel county, praying a modification of said system; which was read and referred to the committee on education.

Mr. Richardson presented the petition of sundry persons of Middletown, in Frederick county, praying for the passage of a law to prevent bullet playing; which was read and referred to Messrs. Richardson, Kemp and M'Kinstrey.

Mr. Watters presented the petition of the trustees and stockholders of the Abingdon academy, in Harford county; praying for a donation to said academy; which was read and referred to the committee on education.

Mr. Duvall presented the petition of Samuel Baldwin, and wife, of Prince-George's county, praying to be placed on the pension list of said county; which was read and referred to the committee on pensions to indigent persons by county assessment.

Mr. M'Elfresh presented the petition of Joshua Ruth, of Frederick county, praying to be released from Frederick county jail; which was read and referred to Messrs. M'Elfresh, Kemp and M'Kinstrey.

Mr. Brown, of Queen-Anne's, presented the petition of
