Mr. Gantt moved to fill the blank with "eight."

Mr. Blakistone moved to postpone the bill indefinitely. On the question being put, it was resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. Turner, from the select committee to whom was referred the bill from the senate, entitled, An act to incorporate the Warren Manufacturing Company, reported the same without amendment.

The said bill was then read the second time by special order and passed.
