Mr. Teackle, chairman of the select committee on the library, submitted the following resolution:

By the *House of Delegates*,  
Jan. 28, 1831.

Resolved, by the general assembly of Maryland, That the clerks of the senate and house of delegates be, and each of them is, hereby directed to deliver to the state librarian, the manuscript votes and proceedings of the several legislatures of the province and state of Maryland in the committee rooms of each house.

Which was read the first, and by special order the second time, and assented to.

Mr. Teackle, chairman of the select committee on the library, submitted the following resolution:

By the *House of Delegates*,  
Jan. 28, 1831.

Resolved by the general assembly of Maryland, That the executive be directed to give notice by advertisement, at least three consecutive weeks before the first day of October next, in one newspaper printed in the city of Baltimore, two on the eastern shore, and three on the western shore, out of the city of Baltimore, that sealed proposals will be received by them, until the last Monday in December, for printing the deficient proceedings of the convention which formed the constitution of this state, and of the legislatures of the province and state of Maryland, and binding the same in leather, so as to complete the number required for the state library; the paper to be as good as of the last session, and the work to be executed according to the type and form of the journal of eighteen hundred and twenty-four, with proper indexes for each year, and that the same be transmitted to the general assembly to be opened at the commencement of the next session.

Mr. Rogerson chairman of the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims, made a favourable report on the petition of Elizabeth J. Waters, widow of Capt. Richard Wa-
