for the use of the state, pay to the said Lucas & Deaver, or to their order, the sum of five hundred dollars, out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated.

Resolved, That the governor cause one copy of the above work to be delivered to each of the clerks of the county courts and registers of wills, and to each of the clerks of the courts of appeals and registers in chancery, to the clerk of the criminal court in Baltimore, and also to the clerk to the commissioners of insolvent debtors, for the use of their respective offices, and the remaining copies to be deposited in the state library.
