The clerk of the senate returned the bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of George Gardiner and William Mudd, of Charles county; also the bill, entitled, An act to abolish the levy court and commissioners of the tax for Calvert county, and for other purposes, severally endorsed "will pass." Ordered to be engrossed. Also the bill, entitled, An act to provide for the fuller administration of justice in equity cases in Allegany county; and the bill, entitled, An act supplementary to the act, entitled, An act to appoint commissioners to establish the boundary line between Harford and Cecil counties, severally endorsed "will pass, with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were severally read the first, and by special order the second time, assented to, and the bills ordered to be engrossed. Also the bill, entitled, An act authorising and empowering the commissioners of Harford county to build a bridge over Deer creek at or near Death's Ford, endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.
