Executive Department,

Annapolis, January 31st, 1831.

Gentlemen of the Senate, and  
of the House of Delegates,

We herewith lay before you resolutions of the general assembly of the state of Vermont, disapproving of the respective alterations proposed to be made in the constitution of the United States, relative to the election of president and vice president, by the states of Georgia and Louisiana.

We also lay before you a memorial of sundry citizens of this state relative to the obstructions in the Susquehanna river mentioned in our communication of the 24th instant, which has just been received at this department.
