The favourable report of the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims, to which was referred the petition of Elizabeth J. Waters, widow of captain Richard Waters, an officer of the revolution, was taken up for consideration, read the second time, the report concurred in, and the resolution therein contained assented to, and sent to the senate.
