The 5th amendment was agreed to by the house.

The 7th amendment was amended by inserting after the word "the," in the 4th line thereof, the words "plaintiff or plaintiffs."

The 8th, 9th, 10th and 11th amendments were agreed to by the house.

The 12th amendment was amended by inserting after the word "any," in the 4th line thereof, the words "plaintiff or plaintiffs."

The 13th amendment was agreed to by the house.

Messrs. Hawkins and Gale, from the joint committee of both houses, appointed for the purpose of examining and counting the votes taken on the joint ballot, for directors on the part of the state in the several banks wherein the state, as a stockholder, is entitled to directors, and of reporting the result, accordingly reported as follows: That from an examination of the ballot boxes, it appeared that there were altogether seventy-four ballots taken.

That for the Mechanics Bank of Baltimore, Francis Neale had 52 votes, Thomas Mummy 28 votes, and William Heald 19 votes.

For the Farmers Bank of Maryland—George Wells 52 votes, and Nicholas Brewer, Jun. 51 votes.

For the Branch Bank of the Farmers Bank, at Easton—William Clark 52 votes, James Price 52 votes.

For the Elkton Bank—Adam Whann had 52 votes.

For the Hagerstown Bank—John Van Lear, Junr. 51, and John Wolgamot 53 votes, and there were 18 blanks.

Whereupon it was declared in the house of delegates, that the following named persons were duly elected directors on the part of the state, in the respective banks above mentioned, for and during the current year, viz.

In the Mechanics Bank of Baltimore—Francis Neale and Thomas Mummy.

In the Farmers Bank of Maryland—George Wells and Nicholas Brewer, Jun.
