By the House of Delegates,

February 2d, 1831.

Gentlemen of the Senate,

Since our message of the 24th ultimo, proposing to close the session on the fifth instant, much business, previously withheld in the country, has been brought before us; we are therefore of opinion that a due regard to the interest of our constituents requires that the session shall continue until Saturday the 12th instant, on which day we propose, with your concurrence, to adjourn sine die.
