The speaker laid before the house a communication from the clerk of Baltimore county court, transmitting the petition of Charity Alderston, praying for a divorce, together with the answer, testimony, and all other proceedings, taken under a commission in said case; which was read and referred to the committee on divorces.

On motion by Mr. Teackle, Ordered, That this house will proceed to the election of a director on the part of the state in the bank of Baltimore, on this day at 12 o'clock.

On motion by Mr. Wright, Ordered, That Henry Davis, of the city of Baltimore, have leave to withdraw his petition and the accompanying documents, filed February 1829, from the files of this house, and that the same be referred to the committee on divorces.

On motion by Mr. Lee, Ordered, That all memorials, plats, maps, communications, or other matters, that have been referred to the committee on internal improvement, be withdrawn from the files of the house, and placed under charge of the librarian of the state.

On motion by Mr. M·Elfresh, the bill reported by him, entitled, An act to incorporate the American Institute at Mount St. Mary's, was read the second time by special order, passed, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Teackle from the joint committee on the library, submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the clerks of the county courts be required to deliver the laws to such persons only in their respective counties as may be entitled to receive the same; and that all laws not demanded by the persons authorised as aforesaid, before the first day of November in each year, shall be returned by the said clerks to the state library.

Which was read.
