On motion by Mr. Hicks, said message was ordered to lie on the table.

The favourable report of the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims, to whom was referred the petition of Doctor Thomas Tillotson, a sergeon in the revolution, was taken up for consideration, read the second time, the report concurred in, and the resolution therein contained, assented to, and sent to the senate.

The unfavourable reports of the committee on claims, to whom was referred the memorials of Mary S. Magee, of the city of Annapolis, and Jacob Lease, of Frederick county; were taken up for consideration, severally read the second time, and concurred in.

The speaker laid before the house a report from the President and Directors of the Chesapeake and Ohio canal company; a report from the Baltimore and Ohio rail road company, in pursuance of the order of the house of delegates of the 5th January 1831, accompanied with the fourth annual report of the president and directors to the stockholders of the Baltimore and Ohio rail road company; which were read and severally referred to the committee on internal improvement.

The speaker also laid before the house a report of the treasurer of the western shore, concerning the Washington monument, in obedience to an order of the house of delegates, of 22d January 1831; which was read and referred to the committee on ways and means.

Mr. Lee presented the memorial of the Chesapeake and Ohio canal company, praying the concurrence of the legislature of Maryland, in certain privileges provided for by the legislature of Virginia; which was read and re erred to the committee on internal improvement.

On motion by Mr. Merrick, Ordered, That the clerk issue subporters, under the direction of the committee of grievances and courts of justice, for any vitness or wit-
