Mr. Edelen submitted the following message; which was read, assented to, and with the bill therein mentioned, sent to the senate.

By the House of Delegates,

February 2, 1831,

Gentlemen of the Senate,

This house have considered the amendments proposed by your honourable body to the bill, entitled, An act to restrain attorneys and solicitors in chancery, from entering their appearance in any suit or action in the courts of this state without special authority. We dissent from the third amendment, and with an amendment by us proposing to insert the words plaintiff or plaintiffs to come in before the word defendant, wherever it occurs, we a sent to all the The object of our amendother amendments proposed. ments to those proposed by your honourable hody is to make the bill in its operation apply as well to plaint:ffs as defendants. The necessity of which, we trust, will appear obvious when the fact is adverted to, that by the practice of the courts under the existing laws any attorney may enter his appearance for the plaint ff to any suit or action, and thereby be legally competent to release the detendant, receive the plaintiff's money, and make any use of it he may think proper, without the authority, knowledge or consent of such plaintiff, whereby injury and loss may sometimes happen to those who may be under the necessity of collecting their debts through the medium of the courts of this With these very brief suggestions, we return the bill and amendments as amended in this house, to your honourable body, and respectfully request that you will re-consider and assent thereto.
