Mr. Lee, chairman of the committee on internal improvement, reported a bill, entitled, An additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act to incorporate a company for the purpose of cutting and making a canal between the river Delaware and the Chesapeake Bay.

Mr. Watters reported a bill, entitled, An act to prevent fishing in Harford and Cecil counties, on a certain day therein mentioned.

Mr. Ridgely reported a bill, entitled, An additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the preservation of the breed of wild deer, and for other purposes therein mentioned, passed at November session 1789, chapter 5.

Mr. Biles reported a bill, entitled, An act to authorise the issuing of attachments by justices of the peace for the recovery of small debts.

Mr. M'Kinstrey reported a bill, entitled, An act to incorporate Westminster, in Frederick county.

Mr. Montgomery reported a bill, entitled, An act authorising Michael Sinnott, of Harford county, to hold certain real estate.

Mr. Harding reported a bill, entitled, A supplement to the act to divorce Rebecca Wilson and James Wilson, passed at December session 1829, chapter 229.

Mr. Wallis reported a bill, entitled, An act relating to the records in the register of wills office, in Kent county.

Mr. Kemp reported a bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the Frederick and Emmitsburg road company.

Mr. Nicholas from the committee on crimes and punishments, reported a bill, entitled, An act to prevent gaming.

Mr. Merrick reported a bill, entitled, An act to provide for the opening of a street in Hager's-Town.

The clerk of the senate returned the bill, entitled, An act altering and changing the name of Stephen Adams to Stephen Henning Adams; also the bill, entitled, An act to abolish the levy court and to provide for the election by the people, of commissioners for Talbot county, and prescribing their powers and duties, severally endorsed 'will pass.' Ordered to be engrossed. Also the bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to regulate the inspection of tobacco so far as relates to Prince-George's county; endorsed 'will pass with the proposed amendments;' which amendments were severally
