The bill reported by Mr. Holmes, entitled, An act to regulate the process to be issued by justices of the peace in certain cases, was taken up for consideration, read the second time and rejected.

On motion by Mr. McKinstrey, the amendments proposed by the senate to the bill, entitled, An act to repeal all such parts of the constitution and form of government as relates to the division of Frederick county into eleven election districts, and for other purposes, were taken up for consideration, read the second time, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.
