Mr. Teackle then moved to strike out the enacting clause of the bill,

Determined in the negative.

On motion by Mr. M·Elfresh the 7th section of the bill was amended by adding at the end thereof, the following proviso, "provided that no one individual shall deposit in said bank, more than one thousand dollars in any one year."

The bill was then read the second time, as amended and passed.

Mr. Hunt from the select committee made a favourable report upon the bill from the senate, entitled, An act to widen Gay street, formerly Bridge street, in the city of Baltimore.

Mr. Nicholas from the select committee made a favourable report upon the bill from the senate, to authorise Jonas McPherson, to lease certain property belonging to the minor children of William Alcock, deceased.

Mr Merrick, from the committee on grievances and courts of justice, made a favourable report, upon the bill from the senate, entitled, An act to confirm an act, entitled, An act to regulate the removal of proceedings, in criminal cases, and to make certain changes in the constitution and form of government, for that purpose.

The house adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.
