

Mr. Tilghman from the committee on ways and means, made an unfavourable report on the memorial of Samuel Gardenhour, of Washington county; which was twice read and concurred in.

Mr. Merrick from the committee on grievances and courts of justice, made an unfavourable report on the petition of Archibald Lewis, and others, praying an alteration of the law prohibiting free people of colour from carrying guns and other weapons; which was read.

Mr. Blakistone from the committee on grievances and courts of justice, made an unfavourable report on the petition of sundry citizens of Frederick county, praying the passage of a law allowing mileage to witnesses and jurors, and for other purposes; which was read.

Mr. Rogerson from the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims, made a favourable report on the petition of Gassaway Pindell, administrator of Nicholas Pindell, a revolutionary soldier, accompanied with the following resolution:

Resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to Gassaway Pindell, administrator of Nicholas Pindell, such sum as shall appear to have been due to the said Pindell at the time of his death, with legal interest thereon.
