The committee to whom was referred the leave to bring in a bill to be entitled, An act relating to the public roads in Calvert county, have had the same under consideration, and beg leave to report—That they conceive it inexpedient at this time to legislate upon the subject.

The unfavourable report of the committee on grievances and courts of justice, to which was referred the petition of sundry citizens of Washington county, praying that the court of appeals for the western shore may be removed to the city of Baltimore, was taken up for consideration, read the second time, and concurred in.

The favourable report of the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims, upon the petition of John Hamilton, of Adair county, Kentucky, a soldier of the revolution, was taken up for consideration, read the second time, the report concurred in, and the resolution therein contained assented to, and sent to the senate.

Mr. Tilghman from the committee on ways and means, made an unfavourable report upon the bill reported by Mr. Hunt, entitled, A third supplement to the act, entitled, An act to regulate the issuing of licenses to traders, keepers of ordinaries, and others, passed at December session 1827, chapter 117; which was read.

Mr. Wallis from the committee, made a favourable report upon the bill from the senate, entitled, An additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act for the relief of the poor of Kent county, passed at November session 1787, chap. 11.
