

On motion by Mr. Kemp, the blank in the 2nd line of the 10th section of the bill was filled up with the word "fifty."

The said bill was then read the second time as amended, passed, and sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate returned the bill, entitled, An act to authorise the recording of the will of Christian Wyandt, late of Washington county. Also

The bill entitled, A farther supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the distribution of a certain fund for the purpose of establishing free schools in the several counties therein mentioned, severally endorsed "will pass." Ordered to be engrossed. Also the bill, entitled, An act to divorce Elizabeth Rawleigh from her husband Greenbury L. Rawleigh, of Dorchester county, endorsed "will not pass."

Also a resolution directing the governor and council to furnish copies of laws to the moderator and commissioners of Hagers-Town, endorsed, "dissented from." And delivered a preamble and resolutions relating to certain obstructions in the river Susquehanna; which was read,

Also communications from John S. Gittings, Esq. president of the Baltimore and Harford Turnpike Company, and John Buck, Esq. president of the Baltimore and Havre-de-Grace Turnpike company, enclosing abstracts of the accounts of said companies, in the prosecution of their works, in conformity to directions in acts of assembly, severally endorsed, "referred to the consideration of the house of delegates.

The bill reported by Mr. M'Elfresh, entitled, An additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors, was taken up for consideration.

When on motion by Mr. Hughlett, the first section of the bill was amended, by inserting after the word "newspapers," in the 14th line thereof, these words "if any be published in the county, otherwise to be set up at the court house door."

On motion by Mr. Steele, said bill was further amended, by adding at the end of the 3d section thereof, the following proviso: Provided, the person or persons making such payment had notice of said proceedings.

The said bill was then read the second time, as amended, and passed.

The bill reported by Mr. Merrick, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the benefit of the University of Maryland, was taken up for consideration.
