Mr. Dalrymple presented a report of the Trustees of Lower-Marlborough Academy; which was read and referred to the committee on education.

The speaker laid before the house a report of the justices of the orphans court of Prince-Georges' county, relative to the school fund of said county; which was read and referred to the committee on education.

On motion by Mr. Teackle. Ordered, That the executive be requested to inform this house of the number of the acts of the present session which will be necessary to supply the requisitions of existing laws and resolutions, as nearly as may be practicable.

Mr. Gantt from the committee, made an unfavourable report on the petition of Eliza Maddux of Worcester county, praying for an allowance for the support of her son Elza Maddux; which was twice read and concurred in.

Mr. Brown of Queen-Anne's submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the general assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the eastern shore be and he is hereby authorised and directed, to enter upon the books of the treasury a credit of \$25 61 in favour of Joseph Wicks 4th (late state's agent) in full for commissions on a certain sum of money recovered on Francis Gillespie's sheriffs bond, and paid into the treasury by the said Joseph Wicks 4th.

Which was read.

Mr. Hunt, from the committee, delivered the following report:

The committee to whom was referred the memorial of Jannet Hollins, of the city of Baltimore, praying the passage of an act to secure to the proprietors of Smith's wharf, in said city, the quiet possession and peaceable enjoyment of the exclusive right to use or receive wharfage for the use of their respective wharves; and also the memorial of the mayor and city council of Baltimore, counter thereto, have carefully considered the same, and having heard the parties by their counsel, have concluded, and now report, That it would in their judgment be improper for the legislature to interfere, as they have been prayed to do.
